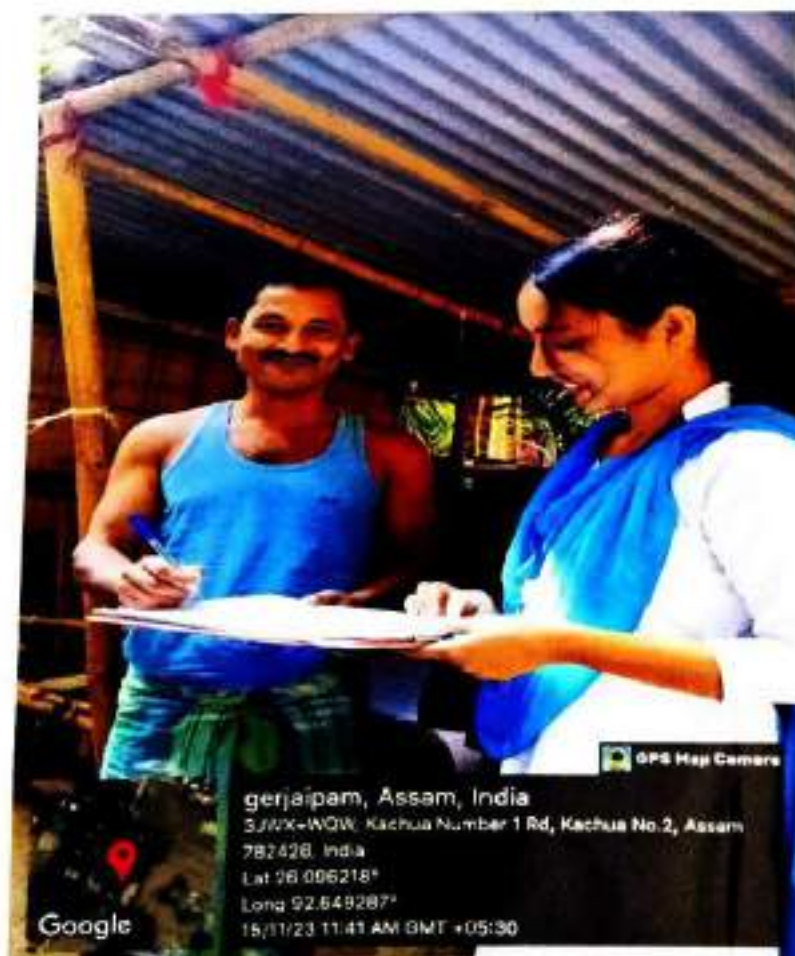
1/ भूमिका :-



About the movie -

2. Discuss Plato's concept of Justice (2014)

⇒ In the entire history of political thought no thinkers have evoked the admiration, reverence and criticism that Plato (428-347 BC) did. This outstanding Greek philosopher has left behind many important works. Among them "The Republic", "The Statesman", and "The Laws" were of perennial interest to all those who are concerned in the history of political ideas.

Plato has been generally regarded as the founder of philosophical idealism by virtue of his conviction that there is a universal idea in the world of eternal reality beyond the world of the senses. He was the first to formulate and define political ideas within a larger framework of a philosophical idea of good. Both Voltaire and Nietzsche characterised that Platonism is the intellectual side of Christianity.

Plato's concept of Justice — The word Justice has been derived from the Greek word "Dikaiosune" which has wider implication than the word Justice. Plato neither

doctrines not which wish to use the word
in the sense in which it is even used today.
According to Platonic concept of justice,
it was closely related to morality and
it properly follow was bound to
save Athens from its decay^{but}?

Method of explaining - Plato applied negative
system in explaining his concept of justice
by discussing the ~~other~~ then existing theories
and exposing their weakness. This
by discussing the weakness of one
theory after another he gave his own

definition of justice. The various theories
discussed by him in this regard include

— Theory of Cephalus (Traditionalism),
Theory of Thrasymachus (Racialism),
& Glaucon's theory (Pragmatism) etc.

Principles of justice -

1. That none should interfere in the
affairs of others, a functional
specialization should be established
in the society on the basis of three
human nature - ^{reason} ~~region~~, spirit and
appetite, resulting in the formation of
three classes - rulers, soldiers and

farmers.

(2). Justice should harmonise wisdom, courage and temperance. It meant that every individual was assigned a place in society according to one's natural aptitudes and skills. so it was

3. Justice should not be individualistic but collective. Platonic justice doesn't think of individual rights but in terms of his duties.

4. Platonic concept of justice means rendering of service to the community as a whole. His concept didn't result with performing legal duties alone. But also in performing universal as well as ethical duties.

5. His concept of justice is not legal but universal. It is neither conventional nor external.

A simple representation of plato's conception of justice can be better explained as follows —

<u>Virtue</u>	<u>Soul</u>	<u>Class</u>
1. Wisdom	rational	ruler
2. Courage	spirited	soldier
3. Temperance	appetite	farmer artisans

Criticisms-

1. It is criticised that this concept is something moral not legal. But in actual practice, no stage of human history law remain a moral ~~concept~~ ^{force}.
2. It was practicable only in the city states where the population was less (5040) and was possible to have perfect division of labour.
3. Plato said that every person possesses three qualities - ~~reason~~ ^{reason}, spirit and appetite. But he advocates for the development of only one quality ~~leaving~~ leaving the remaining $2/3$ underdeveloped.
4. It is not humanitarian but totalitarian. It place top position to philosopher class resulting totalitarian govt.
5. It is static concept, doesn't move with changing times.

In spite of the above defects the significance of Plato's concept lies in the fact that ~~it~~ for the first time any theory give stress on functional

Restoration Period

* Graveyard school of Poetry: Group of 18th c poets who took death, loss and mourning as the themes of their poems.

Some eg: The Grave (1743) by Robert Blair

Night Thoughts - Edward Young

Elegy written in a Country Churchyard - Thomas Gray

* The 'Restoration period': started ~~from~~ when Charles II ascended the British throne in 1660.

* Important milestone of Restoration Period / turmoil:

① The Popish plot ② the attempt of Monmouth to come to power ③ Party conflicts between the Whigs and Tories

* The Act of Uniformity - 1662 marginalisation of the puritans.

* Imp publication: Paradise lost (1667) - John Milton

The Pilgrim's Progress (1654) - John Bunyan

* 2 imp Theatres: Charles II granted William Davenant and Thomas Killigrew in August 1660. Only the King's Company (Killigrew) and the Duke's Company (Davenant) had the license to theatrical activities.

* Davenant introduced heroic plays into Restoration theatre while it was actually Dryden who brought innovation and enriched the genre.

eg of Heroic play: The Conquest of Granada (1672)

Dryden
Roger Boyle: Henry V (1664), The Black Prince (1667)

* Theatre was banned for 15 years (1649-1660)

functioned as an association of people united in cultivating the scientific temper and following the recognition by Royal Charter in 1662, it was a platform facilitating scientific understanding. It dealt with science & humanist culture

& Prose: Dryden, Sprat, Clarendon.

eg: Essay of Dramatic Poesie (1668) - Subjects in literary relation on genres as comedy, tragedy, satire & poetry.
Edward Hyde (First Earl of Clarendon) - on historical between the conflict of Monarchy & Puritans 'True Historical Narratives of the Rebellion and Civil wars in England' → first historical narrative in English language.

* Women's writing - Aphra Behn (1640-1689) Most prominent of 17th c. The Rover (1677, 1681) - Comedy of Manners, practice of extreme feminist.

* Margaret Cavendish (1623-73) → Metaphysical & feminine Poems & Fancies (1653)

* Katherine Philips (1632-64) → Love, Marriage & difficulty in Marriage, friendship. → metaphysical, and gender relations

* Mary Astell (1666-1731) A Serious Proposal to the Ladies (1694) → space in women's lives.

* Anne Killigrew (1660-1685) → issue of authorship is her theme in her poems.

* founders of Royal Society - Christopher Wren, Robert Boyle, John Wilkins, William Brouncker & Robert Moray.
Organized on Nov 28, 1660.

- * Scientific Revo — origin is traced to Copernicus question of the Ptolemaic model of the Universe.
 - * 'On the Revolution of the Spheres' (1543)
- * Ockham's Razor — theory — the view that when 2 ideas seems to fit the facts under observation, the one having the lesser assumptions is to be taken. The simplest most elegant explanation is usually the one closest to the truth.
- * Copernicus's studies were continued by Tycho Brahe and Johannes Kepler → he worked through math Paradigm
- * Galileo a successor to these Scientists — he used telescope. → 'A Dialogue Bet the 2 Great world Systems' (1632).
- * French word 'Philosophe' means — a free thinker.
- * Thinkers — Francis Bacon — believed a blind adherence to the inherited past was a major deterrent to the path of new knowledge. unless backed by reason could hamper proper enquiry → inductive method. 'Novum Organum' (1620)
- * Rene Descartes — A French Philosopher — father of Modern Philosophy
- * Immanuel Kant & David Hume — non-French thinkers working towards the thesis of Enlightenment of 18th c
- * Voltaire (1694-1778) Frenchman, was Francois Marie Arouet. — radical exponent of freedom and despise any form of domination — He was a staunch Newtonian
 - Philosophical Letters (1734)
 - He was an advocate of the right of intellectual opinion and a defender of freedom of speech.
 - He attacked religious bigotry and was in favour of rationalism.

(Franch)

* Diderot & Condorcet on the other hand argued that proper progress was impossible without active participation of women.

* Most celebrated view on gender came from Mary Wollstonecraft - women in no way inferior to men. He argued that women have the same capacity for work and reasoning. She questioned the disparity of marriage law and questioned women's property rights.

- she saw domestication of women to weaken women
- culture made their weakness appear natural
- primary objective of girls is marriage
- she advocated education for promotion of independence and emancipation

* Alexander Pope - prominent poet of Augustan Age.

* Neo-classical temper in - Dryden ('Mac Flecknoe') to attack his rival Thomas Shadwell. Use of satire and mockery.

* The Dunciad (1728) - Pope masterpiece of Neo-classical Verse.

* James Thomson - Augustan feeling saw nature in him ('The Seasons') - a classic of 18th c.

* Samuel Johnson - neo-classic (London 1738) a satire on the decaying culture of contemporary England - intellectual and moral poverty of the age.


