Dept. of Economics



2ND SEMESTER

This course aims to introduce the students to the basic concepts of macroeconomics. It discusses the preliminary concepts associated with determination and measurement of aggregate macroeconomic variable.

ECO-HC-2026: MATHEMATICAL METHODS IN ECONOMICS- II

The objective of this paper is to enable the students to learn how to solve the economic problems by using mathematical tools.

3RD SEMESTER

ECO-HC-3016: INTERMEDIATE MICROECONOMICS-I

This course is designed to provide a sound knowledge in microeconomic theory and in this course mathematical tools are used to facilitate understanding of the basic concepts. This course looks at the behaviour of the consumer and the producer and also the behaviour of a competitive firm.

ECO-HC-3026: INTERMEDIATE MACROECONOMICS-1

After studying this paper students will learn various alternative theories of output and employment determination in a closed economy in the short run as well as medium run, and the role of policy in this context. It also introduces the students to various theoretical issues related to an open economy.

ECO-HC-3036: STATISTICAL METHODS FOR ECONOMICS

This course helps the students to know the basic concepts and terminology that are fundamental to statistical analysis and inference. Concepts like probability, probability distribution of discrete and continuous random variables, sampling techniques used to collect survey data. This course also includes some topics in statistical inference such as point and interval estimation.

4TH SEMESTER

ECO-HC-4016: INTERMEDIATE MICROECONOMICS-II

This course will provide students the conceptual clarity to use mathematical tools and reasoning in microeconomics. It covers general equilibrium and welfare, imperfect markets and topics under information economics.

ECO-HC-4026: INTERMEDIATE MACROECONOMICS-II

In this course, students are introduced to the long run dynamic issues like growth and technical progress. It also provides the micro - foundations to the various aggregative concepts of macroeconomics.

ECO-4036: INTRODUCTORY ECONOMETRICS

This course provides a comprehensive introduction to basic econometric concepts and techniques. It covers statistical concepts of hypothesis testing, estimation and diagnostic testing of sample and multiple regression models. The students will also learn about the consequences of and tests for misspecification of regression models.

5TH SEMESTER

ECO-HC-5016: INDIAN ECONOMY-I

This course reviews major trends in economic indicators and policy debates in India in the post- independence period with particular emphasis on paradigm shift and turning point .

ECO-HC-5026: DEVELOPMENT ECONOMICS-I

This course provides knowledge of alternative conceptions of development. The axiomatic basis for inequality measurement is used to develop measures of inequality and connections between growth and inequality are explored. The course also provides linkage between political institutions to growth and inequality by discussing the role of the state in economic development and the informational and incentive problems that affects state governance.

5TH SEMESTER DSE COURSE

ECO-HE-5016: ECONOMICS OF HEALTH AND EDUCATION

This course provides a microeconomic framework to analyze , among other things education, individual choice in the demand for health and education ,government intervention and aspects of inequity and discrimination in both sectors .It also gives an overview of health and education in India.

ECO-HE-5026: MONEY AND FINANCIAL MARKETS

This course exposes students to the theory and functioning of the financial and monetary sectors of the economy. It highlights the organization, structure and role of financial markets and institutions. It also discusses interest rates, monetary management and instruments of monetary control. The course also covers the financial and banking sector reforms and monetary policy with special reference to India

ECO-HE-5036: PUBLIC FINANCE

The students will learn about the efficiency and equity aspects of taxation of the centre, states and the local governments and the issue of fiscal federalism and the decentralising in INDIA,

This course will be useful for students towards careers in the government sector, policy analysis, business and journalism.

6TH SEMESTER

ECO-HC-6016: INDIAN ECONOMY-II

After completion of this course students will learn about the sector specific policies and their impact in shaping trends in key economic indicators in India. It highlights major policy debates and evaluates the Indian empirical evidence.

ECO-HC-6026: DEVELOPMENT ECONOMICS-II

This course let the students to acquire knowledge on the basic demographic concepts and their evolution during the process of development. This course also explains about the governance of communities and organizations and about the sustainable growth.

DSE-6TH SEMESTER

ECO-HE-6016: ENVIRONMENTAL ECONOMICS

This course focuses on economic causes of environmental problems. Economic implications of environmental policies are also addressed as well as valuation of environmental quality, quantification of environmental damages, tools for evaluation are also discussed.

ECO-HE-6026: INTERNATIONAL ECONOMICS

The students will learn the composition, direction and consequences of international trade, the determinants and effects of trade policy. The course also helps to analyse the causes and consequences of rapid expansion of international financial flows in recent years. The students will also be exposed to real world examples and case studies.

ECO-HE-6036: THE ECONOMY OF ASSAM

After completion of this course the students will learn about the economic condition of ASSAM. The features of the economy of ASSAM, trends of state domestic product, its demographic features, level of unemployment, poverty, regional disparity, policies taken to eradicate unemployment and poverty during plan period, its main resources ,trends and composition of industrial output, agricultural output, infrastructural facilities etc. are some of the topics that help the students to have knowledge about the economic condition of the state.

3RD SEMESTER ECO-RC/HG-: PRINCIPLES OF MACROECONOMICS-I/ FUNDAMENTALS OF MACRO ECONOMICS.

This course introduces the basic concepts in macroeconomics. In this course the students are introduced to the definition, measurement of macro-economic variables like GDP, consumption, savings, investment and balance of payments. The course also explains various theories of determining GDP in the short run.

Started with Preamble, Fundamental Rights, Directive of State Policy and functioning of different institution of government are highlighted in this paper. It also includes party system, social movements, development strategies etc.

POL HG 3016 Comparative Government and Politics

Course Outcomes:

- To make students have a basic understanding of comparative political analysis,
- To make students learn the classification of political systems from a comparative politics framework.
- To make students learn the classification of governments and the political behaviour of institutions and the changes in the nature of the nation-state.

POL HG 4016 Introduction to International Relations


